On average, more than **1 in 3 women** and **1 in 4 men** in the US will experience rape, physical violence, and/or stalking by an intimate partner.



1 in 10 high school students have experienced physical violence from a partner in the last year alone.

One study found that children exposed to violence in the home were **15 times** more likely to be physically and/or sexually assaulted than the national average.

Nearly **1 in 3 college women** say they've been in an abusive dating relationship. Over an average 5-year college career, between **20-25%** of college women reported being raped. Only 5 in 100 reported.



12% of children under 18 in TN live with relatives; 2% are in the foster care system or with unrelated adults.

WRAP partners with survivors in their healing journey, providing them with the education, tools, and support they need to build resilience, self-confidence, and a strong sense of independence, so they can build healthy, stable, nurturing relationships that are based on equality and not dependence.

We can help file Orders of Protection, create a safety plan, assess levels of risk, provide a safe home assessment, offer psycho-educational therapy, connect survivors with resources, and support families caring for the children of relatives.

How to Connect Survivors to WRAP:

Encourage those you serve or encounter to call WRAP's helpline at **800-273-8712**. To protect their confidentiality and autonomy, the survivor must reach out to us. If you are with them, they must give us verbal consent to talk with you on their behalf. We can provide anyone who calls with an overview of our services and provide guidance on how we can help. We require written consent to share a participant's information with anyone.

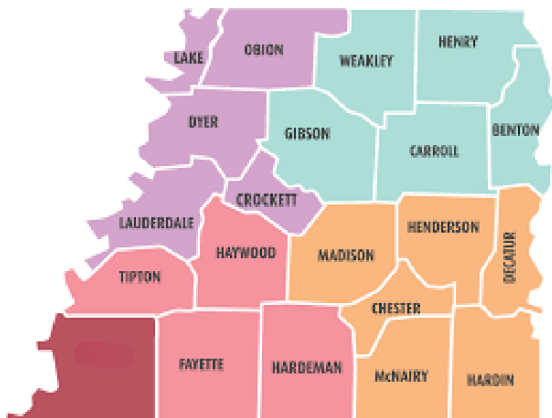

WRAP's services are offered throughout 20 counties in West Tennessee. Support for survivors of domestic or sexual violence is offered in all counties except Fayette. The Relative Caregiver Program is offered in all 20 counties. WRAP's coverage area does not include Shelby County.

Our Core Programs

Domestic Violence Response
Sexual Assault Response
Residential Services
Relative Caregiver Program
DCS Liaison Program

These programs provide comprehensive services that include:

- 24/7 helpline for crisis stabilization
- Counseling and therapeutic services
- Emergency housing in safe homes
- Permanent housing via rental assistance and rapid rehousing
- Court, medical, and socio-economic advocacy services
- Emergency financial, clothing, food, and transportation assistance
- Connections to formal and informal community resources
- Support for parents navigating the child welfare system
- Support and resources for families caring for the children of relatives

WRAP services are free and confidential. Services are offered to any individual, regardless of age, sex, race, color, sexual orientation, gender identity, disability, ethnicity, religion or any protected class.



We Support Children

- WRAP-DCS Domestic Violence Partnership
- Support for children exposed to violence in the home or teen survivors of sexual assault
- Relative Caregiver Program

WRAP partners with local law enforcement to implement a **Lethality Assessment Protocol (LAP)** Coordinated Victim Response.



WRAP's sexual assault advocates are on call 24/7 for **hospital accompaniment** for sexual assault forensic exams.



Relative Caregiver Program (RCP)

New in 2023, WRAP became the provider of the state's Relative Caregiver Program for West Tennessee. This program provides support and resources to relatives who are caring for children who cannot live with their parents, such as those who have experienced abuse or neglect. The goal of the program is to help keep children in a safe, stable, nurturing environment and out of the foster care system.
